**3** *Ardors* â€™Fierce or burning heatâ€™(QED).

**16** *Embossings* â€™To adorn with figures or other ornamentation in reliefâ€™(QED).

**18** *AEther* â€™The clear sky; the upper regions of space beyond the cloudsâ€™(QED).

**20** *Fervors* â€™Glowing condition, intense heatâ€™(QED).

**25** *MECENAS* Gaius Cilnius Maecenas (c.70 BC-c. 8 BC), Roman politician, counselorÂ to the emperorÂ Augustus, and wealthy patron of such poets as Virgil and Horace. His name became synonymous with ideal literary patronage by the eighteenth century (*Encyclopedia Britannica*).

**29** *MARIA* Mastersâ€™s poetic name for herself.

**32** *benignant* â€™Cherishing or exhibiting kindly feeling towards inferiors or dependants; gracious, benevolent (with some suggestion of condescension or patronage)â€™(QED).
